

On Friday, all of the students took a walking field trip to the Cooper Landing Community Library where they got a tour, new students got library cards, and everybody had an opportunity to check out books.


By the end of the day on Friday it was evident that the 2016/2017 school year is going to be a fabulous one with learning, friends, and fun for all.




Seward Music and Arts Festival
