As winter settles in on us, the station would like to outfit the volunteers with a key piece of equipment so the volunteers can operate more safely during an



emergency. We are looking for some help from our community and beyond. CLES would like to purchase 28 sets of Diamond ice cleats. The ice cleats cost about \$43 each for a total of \$1,204. These ice cleats provide great traction, stay flexible in sub zero temps, and don't get bound up with slushy snow and ice. There is a Volunteer Firefighters Assistant (VFA) grant that we are going to apply for to get some more gear such as gloves for both structure and extrication, nomex hoods, intrinsically safe lights, tools, etc, however, the money doesn't get distributed until April or May, and we need Ice Cleats before then. National Heritage Area

The Board of Directors for the Kenai Mountains-Turnagain Arm Corridor Communities Association recently finalized a new <u>Strategic Sustainability Plan</u> to focus implementation of the management plan for the KMTA National Heritage Area.

Designated in 2009, KMTA NHA is one of 49 National Heritage Areas in the United States. Not only is this area

nationally recognized for its unique historical, cultural, natural, and recreational importance, but the KMTA CCA Board and staff have worked to award almost \$1,000,000 in federal funding to support local community projects. Through this work, KMTA CCA has increased awareness of the National Heritage Area and leveraged an additional \$1.7 million dollars in further investment within KMTA's nine communities of Bird, Indian, Girdwood, Whittier, Portage, Hope, Cooper Landing, Moose Pass, and Seward.

Dear Kenai Peninsula Community Member and Partners –

We want to thank you again for your thoughtful feedback on the DRAFT Kenai Peninsula Borough Comprehensive Plan, 2018 Update (dated December 2017). Since receiving all of your comments this past spring, our team has continued to work closely with Borough staff and leadership to consider and thoughtfully respond to your recommendations and to make other improvements to the draft plan. We greatly appreciate your patience, and we are excited to announce we are getting closer to releasing the **REVISED Public Hearing Draft** of the updated plan. Important next steps include:

- Late January 2019 The Borough will release the REVISED Public Hearing Draft.
- February/March 2019 The KPB Planning Commission will hold one or more public hearings to take public testimony on the draft plan, and will make a recommendation to the assembly to approve/not approve the plan.
  - March/April 2019 The KPB Assembly will hold a public hearing and take an official vote on plan adoption.

When the revised public hearing draft is released in January, we will widely email and post a detailed schedule of Planning Commission and Assembly hearings. When you receive that email, please help us get the word out by forwarding it to your KPB family, friends, neighbors and co-workers We look forward to a lot of participation at the public hearings, as this will be your opportunity to provide in-person comments and support for the plan.

In the interim, you can always connect with the project team with your comments, questions, concerns.
